Responding to Sexual Misconduct on Campus

What is my responsibility and role under Title IX?

Confidential Resources:

Sometimes when a person experiences sexual violence, they want to get advice from someone who is not required to connect them with resources and can keep the details of their experience confidential.

For students at Wesleyan, this includes:

- Any clinician or therapist with Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS).
- Any health care provider at Davidson Health Center.
- Any clergy with the Office of Religious and Spiritual Life.

Responsible Employees:

All Wesleyan faculty and staff who are not listed as confidential, are understood to be "responsible employees."

This means they are required by university policy as well as state and federal guidance to make the appropriate staff aware of any incident.

If you know someone has experienced sexual misconduct of any kind, you are required to connect the individual to the Title IX Officer or Deputy Title IX Officer.
